All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination by **July 10, 2015**, the final filing date.

NOTE: Accepted applicants are required to bring either a photo identification card or two forms of signed identification to each phase of the examination.

All applications/resumes must include "from" and "to" employment dates (month/day/year), time base, and applicable civil service class titles. Applications/resumes received without this information will be rejected.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Possession of the following certificates:

A valid and current second-class Airman's Medical Certificate issued by an FAA authorized examiner.

and

1. A valid FAA Commercial Pilot Certificate with multi-engine land airplane and instrument ratings. **or**
2. A valid FAA Airline Transport Pilot (ATP) Certificate with multi-engine land airplane ratings and instrument ratings. **or**
3. A valid FAA Commercial Airman Certificate with a helicopter-rotocraft class rating. **or**
4. A valid ATP Certificate with helicopter-rotocraft class rating.

and

1,000 hours in command of aircraft (fixed- or rotary-wing).

“Either I”

One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of an Aviation Officer I (Maintenance). (Applicants who have completed six months of service performing the duties of an Aviation Officer I (Maintenance) will be admitted to the examination, but they must satisfactorily complete one year of this experience before they can be eligible for appointment.)

“Or II”

One year of experience in government service performing watershed and fire protection duties which have included a full-time assignment as a base manager or an air attack coordinator during the declared fire season.

“Or III”

Five hundred additional hours in command of either fixed- or rotary-wing aircraft performing low-level missions (e.g., wildland fire control, external loads, medi-vac operations, search and rescue, aerial surveys, etc.).

NOTE: APPLICANTS QUALIFYING UNDER PATTERN III ABOVE MUST PROVIDE THE NUMBER OF HOURS IN COMMAND OF EITHER FIXED- OR ROTARY-WING AIRCRAFT PERFORMING LOW-LEVEL MISSIONS. YOU MUST ALSO DESCRIBE IN DETAIL THE TYPE OF MISSION (E.G., WILDLAND FIRE CONTROL, EXTERNAL LOADS, MEDI-VAC OPERATIONS, SEARCH AND RESCUE, AERIAL SURVEYS, ETC.) AND THE TYPE OF AIRCRAFT (E.G., FIXED- OR ROTARY-WING).

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Incumbents at this level develop and implement standard flight operational procedures; train and evaluate pilots, and ensure that pilots perform their duties in accordance with Federal, State, and departmental rules, regulations, procedures, and directives. Incumbents are also involved in assigned study projects; prepare recommendations on the use of specialized aircraft, modifications of aircraft, and development of methods and procedures for air operations; perform qualification and flight standardization checks for pilots; develop and monitor aviation training programs; evaluate effectiveness of air operations; as needed, act as relief and primary pilot of State-owned and contracted aircraft in the performance of fire suppression and vegetation management projects; ensure that the Department’s Aviation Management Program is conducted in a safe manner and in compliance with applicable mandates; monitor and assure contractor compliance with provisions of various agreements with the Department; will participate in or provide technical support for aviation accident investigations, and do other related work.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

Qualifications Appraisal Interview: It is anticipated that interviews will be held during **August/September 2015**.

The examination will consist of a qualifications appraisal interview weighted 100%. The interview will include a number of predetermined job-related questions. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. **CANDIDATES WHO DO NOT APPEAR FOR THE INTERVIEW WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

Scope:

Knowledge of:

1. Available aviation weather reports and pertinent application to ensure safe flight operations.
2. Practical application of aircraft operation practices and procedures to perform and provide guidance and standardization in the operation of Department utilized aircraft.
3. CAL FIRE, Federal Aviation Administration, and other regulations governing aircraft operations (e.g., California Department of Transportation, U.S. Forest Service, Department of Interior, military) to ensure program compliance.
4. The English language and grammar to effectively communicate within the Department and with the public.
5. Aviation terminology and principles for proper application to the job.
6. Federal, State, and Department rules, regulations, procedures, and directives to make recommendations on the use of specialized aircraft.
7. Aviation notifications (e.g., bulletins, emergency directives, memos) to ensure compliance with industry standards and safe operating practices.
8. Instructional techniques in basic maneuvers, aerial firefighting, and ground training to instruct flight staff in flight operation procedures to meet the needs of the program.
9. Aerial firefighting techniques and procedures for proper application of fire suppression efforts in accordance with the Department's mission.
10. Aircraft performance capabilities to accommodate weight fluctuations during flight (e.g., retardant drop, water bucket collection and drop, insertion and extraction of a rescuer and/or victim) to maintain airworthiness.
11. Various training techniques, resources, and requirements to ensure readiness of flight personnel.
12. Various office equipment (e.g., computer, fax, printer) to perform the duties of the job.

Skill to:

1. Read, write, and understand English to effectively apply Federal and interagency regulations, Department policies, and other publications in accordance with Federal Aviation Administration regulations.
2. Operate aircraft to commercial standards by utilizing the Federal Aviation Administration and interagency Pilot Practical Test Standards in the fire environment.
3. Conduct aerial firefighting activity in aircraft in accordance with established Department and interagency standards, policies, and procedures to practice safe fire suppression activity.
4. Develop, implement, and revise standard flight operation procedures to meet the needs of the program.
5. Communicate effectively to Aviation personnel at a technical level required to perform the duties of the job.
6. Operate all information technology devices (e.g., smartphones, computers, tablets) for correspondence, effective job performance, and communication.
7. Operate desktop software (e.g., Microsoft Office, Internet Explorer) to electronically compile and analyze data, produce reports, and manage operations.

Ability to:

1. Read and write to effectively exchange information and accomplish daily tasks.
2. Operate aircraft in accordance with Department, federal and industry standards.
3. Maintain positive relationships with cooperating agencies to promote a harmonious and productive work environment.
4. Work with diverse groups of individuals with varying levels of education and skills.
5. Analyze situations and recommend an effective course of action for fire suppression and an effective job performance in accordance with the Department's mission.
6. Read and understand reference manuals, training materials, data, and correspondence to acquire knowledge essential to the performance of the job.
7. Plan the work of others in operation of aircraft types used by CAL FIRE in the Departments' mission.
8. Organize the work of others in operation of aircraft types used by CAL FIRE in the Departments' mission.
9. Direct the work of others in operation of aircraft types used by CAL FIRE in the Departments' mission.
10. Forecast the needs of the program to ensure operational readiness.

VETERANS PREFERENCE

Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows: 1) any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference, 2) An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination, 3) Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.

CAREER CREDITS

Three career credits will be added to the final score of all competitors in this examination who qualify for the credits and attain a passing mark on the examination. (See "General Information" on this bulletin for information regarding career credits.)

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

Willingness to wear personal protective equipment (PPE); to wear a uniform; to maintain uniform in compliance with Uniform Maintenance standards; to participate in emergency response; to take direction; to maintain necessary licenses and certifications; to perform duty officer responsibilities; to travel; to work non-scheduled hours; including weekends and holidays; to participate in accident investigations; to maintain composure in stressful situations; to work in a group setting; to adapt to changing situations; to work independently; to be open to the principles of Crew Resource Management in aircraft operations; to maintain personal appearance to comply with the department grooming standards; to accept new responsibilities; to work with diverse personalities; to take on multiple responsibilities; to work in remote locations; to direct the work of others and to take direction from subordinates on an incident.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection three weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received his/her notice.

If a candidate's notice of oral interview or performance test fails to reach him/her three days prior to their scheduled appointment due to a verified postal error, he/she will be rescheduled upon written request.

Examination Locations: When a written test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. However, locations of interviews or performance evaluations may be limited or extended as conditions warrant.

Applications are available online at CalHR, local offices of the Employment Development Department and the testing Department on this job bulletin.

If you meet the requirements stated on this bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination will be compared with the performance of the others who take this test, and all candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

The testing Department reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service, if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the classification. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) Departmental promotional, 3) multi-Departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) Departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin.

Veterans' Preference: Effective January 1, 2014, in accordance with Government Codes 18973.1 and 18973.5, Veterans' Preference will be awarded as follows: 1) Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for Veterans' Preference. 2) An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination. And 3) Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status. Veteran status is verified by the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). Directions to apply for Veterans' Preference are on the Veterans' Preference Application (Std. Form 1093), which is available at <http://jobs.ca.gov/Job/VeteransInformation>, and the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Career Credits: In open, non promotional examinations, career credits are granted to: 1) State employees with permanent civil service status, 2) full-time employees of the State who are exempt from State civil service pursuant to the provisions of Section 4 of Article VII of the California Constitution, and who meet all qualification requirement specified by the Board and have 12 consecutive months of service in an exempt position, and 3) individuals who have served one full year in, or are graduates of, the California Conservation Corps (eligibility shall expire 24 months after graduation from the California Conservation Corps). Three points are added to the final test score of those candidates who meet the above criteria, and who are successful in the examination. Such examinations cannot be for managerial positions described in Government Code Section 3513. Competitors not currently employed in State civil service who have mandatory reinstatement rights may also be eligible for career credits, but they must explain their service status in the appropriate section of the Examination/Employment Application. Confidentiality and Security: Pursuant to Government Code Sections 19680(c) and 19681(b) it is unlawful to copy and/or furnish confidential examination material for the purpose of either improving or injuring the chances of any person or to obtain examination questions or other examination material before, during, or after an examination. Every person violating these provisions is guilty of a misdemeanor, and adverse action will be pursued. This may result in the person being barred from competition in future examinations, withheld from certification lists, or cancellation of eligibility for employment in State civil service.
