Mariposa- The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) Madera-Mariposa-Merced Unit (MMU) has announced effective at 8:00 a.m. Sunday, May 1, 2016 all hazard reduction burning will require a permit in Mariposa County. Permits are required year round in Madera County.

The following guidelines are required when conducting a hazard reduction burn:

- Property owners conducting hazard reduction burning are responsible for checking the burn day status. **Madera County: 1-877-429-2876** **Mariposa County 209-966-1200**
- You must clear all flammable material and vegetation within 10 feet of the outer edge of the burn pile.
- Keep a water supply close to the burning site.
- An adult must be in attendance with a shovel until the fire is out.
- No burning shall be undertaken unless weather conditions (particularly wind) are such that burning can be considered safe.
- Remember NO household trash, processed wood or garbage can be burned
- Permits may be obtained at the nearest CAL FIRE or Madera County Fire Station.
