

# California Statewide Fire Summary

## Friday, September 26, 2014

Rainfall across Northern California aided firefighters in their efforts towards containment of the 3 remaining wildfires in California. Today approximately 8,100 firefighters remain on the frontlines. Cooler temperatures are likely for the next several days, but over the weekend a dry and warming trend is expected. The risk for wildfires will increase next week.
