

California Statewide Fire Summary

Saturday, September 27, 2014

Cooler weather and rain has continued to aid firefighters in their containment efforts. Over 6,700 firefighters continue to battle 3 major wildfires in California, but are nearing containment on all of them and many firefighters are being released to return home. Progress has been made after the past couple of weeks spike in fire activity, when at the peak 12 major wildfires were burning and over 8,400 firefighters were on the frontlines.

The potential for large fire will be low through this weekend due to below normal temperatures and higher humidity. The large fire threat will increase some next week as temperatures become above normal and humidity drops into the teens.
