Current Situation:

Crews continue to check for hot spots in the north and northeast sections of the fire. Due to the predicted red flag conditions this afternoon, fire crews will monitor all sections of the fire and continue to secure containment lines. The south and west sections of the fire are secure.

Evacuation Orders Lifted;

All evacuation orders and road closures have been rescinded. The following are the affected areas;

- Oynett Road, Kanaka Ranch Road to Island Bar Hill Road are now open.
- Cochise Drive, Blackhawk Trail, Crystal Ranch Road, Toyon Hills Drive and all roads south of Lumpkin Road, east of Happy Hollow Lane to the end of the pavement are now open.
- The road closure located on Lumpkin Road at Happy Hollow Lane has been lifted except for the following: Lumpkin Road will remain closed to through “truck” traffic until 8:00 a.m. Monday August 11, 2008 and will open to all traffic at that time.

Additional Information:

- We ask that all residents in the affected area remain vigilant and to monitor the fire area reporting any significant smokes that may appear. We also ask that all residents in the affected area drive slowly and carefully due to heavy fire resource commitment still in the area. *Preservation of life remains the number one priority.*
- As a result of the lightning activity that occurred late Monday and early Tuesday morning, there were seventeen additional fires. Out of those seventeen fires, three were significant; The Webb Fire located in the Webb Hollow Cohasset area, the Chico Fire located south of Soda Springs off of Highway 32 and the Pine Fire located northeast of the Chico. Eight of the seventeen fires were contained to ¼ of an acre or less. This series of lightning fires is now **100%** contained.
