

California Statewide Fire Summary

Friday, September 6, 2013

Over 4,700 firefighters continue to battle six major wildfires burning across California. Yesterday two were contained and two more sparked in Modoc County. The Rim Fire burning near and in Yosemite National Park has now burned 246,350 acres (385 square miles) and is 80% contained. The Rim Fire continues to actively burn and is now the 3rd largest wildfire in California's recorded history. [See the Top 20 list](#). Now that the threat to the State Responsibility Area, which CAL FIRE protects, has diminished and as the fire continues to burn on federal land, CAL FIRE will be transitioning out of unified command later today. The United States Forest Service and the National Park Service will continue to manage the fire.

Even though summer is nearing to an end, CAL FIRE reminds all Californians that the State experiences its largest and damaging wildfires in September and October. All residents and visitors are encouraged to remain extra fire safe. For more information on how to be prepared for a wildfire visit ReadyForWildfire.org.

As there are no current major wildfires burning in CAL FIRE's responsibility area, and as the remaining fires are on federal land, this will be the last statewide fire summary until fire activity increases. *For continued information on the federal fires please visit www.inciweb.org.*
