## MENDOCINO LIGHTNING COMPLEX FIVE PERCENT CONTAINED

The Mendocino Lightning Complex has burned approximately 19,200 acres. There are currently approximately 107 fires. Five percent have been contained, with multiple fires increasing in size. Resources continue to remain limited due to the fires throughout Northern California, with resources being assigned as they become available. Due to declining weather conditions, anticipated fire behavior and significantly increased threats are a possibility. Further areas may be identified for evacuation warnings later today.

**Evacuations:** Evacuation Warnings have been issued in Montgomery Woods/ Orr Springs Road to Running Springs Road; Mountain View/ Mile Post 9 Area; Red Mountain/ Bell Springs from Hwy 101 to 13600 Bell Springs Road; Chicken Ridge Area; Navarro/ Flynn Creek; Cherry Creek/ Intersection Highways 101 and 162; The Community of Cummings; Town of Leggett; De Haven Creek and Howard Creek drainage, north of Westport.
