MENDOCINO LIGHTNING COMPLEX

The Mendocino Lightning Complex has burned approximately 27,000 acres with five percent containment. There are currently 72 active fires. Multiple fires are increasing in size. Resources continue to remain limited due to the fires throughout Northern California, with resources being assigned as they become available. Due to Red Flag weather conditions significant increased threats are a possibility. Further areas may be identified for Evacuation Warnings.

Evacuations

Evacuation Orders have been issued in:

- Greenfield Subdivision: From Fred MacMurray Lane to Main Ranch Road. From Main Ranch Road to Orr Springs Road to the Singley Ranch (12000 Orr Springs Road)

Evacuation Warnings have been issued in:

- Community of Rockport
- Montgomery Woods/ Orr Springs Road to Running Springs Road
- Mountain View/ Mile Post 9 Area
- Red Mountain/ Bell Springs Road (From Hwy 101 to the intersection of Red Mountain and Bell Springs Road)
- The Community of Cummings
- Town of Leggett
- De Haven Creek and Howard Creek drainage, North of Westport
