MENDOCINO LIGHTNING COMPLEX

The Mendocino Lightning Complex has burned approximately 39,500 acres and is 40% contained. Progress is being made on the various fires throughout the county; there are currently 40 active fires and 83 contained fires. Remaining fires continue to slowly increase in size. Continued threats remain a possibility to communities and critical infrastructure. Firefighting resources continue to arrive daily and military resources are expected to arrive in the next few days. Weather conditions are currently favorable, however a warming trend is expected which can increase fire behavior. Additional Evacuation "Warnings" and/ or "Orders" may be issued. Planned firing operations have been successful and may occur in other areas of the county as necessary. For this reason, residents are reminded that they may see increased fire and smoke.

Anderson Valley Volunteer Firefighter, Bob Roland, was transported to Ukiah Valley Medical Center on July 2, 2008, after suffering respiratory distress while working on the Oso fire. He passed away during the early morning hours of July 3, 2008.

Air Operations

GIS (Geographic Information System) mapping operations are being conducted throughout Mendocino County. Residents may see low flying rotary aircraft for the purposes of mapping fire perimeters.

Fixed wing and rotary aircraft continue to operate on the fires.
