## MENDOCINO LIGHTNING COMPLEX

The Mendocino Lightning Complex has consumed 53,200 acres and is 85% contained. There are 6 active fires. Continued threats remain a possibility to communities and critical infrastructure. Additional evacuation "Warnings" and/ or "Orders" may be issued should conditions change. Favorable weather conditions continue to be predicted this weekend and into next week. Firefighters are taking advantage of the favorable weather conditions and are making good progress on containment. Residents are reminded that they may see increased fire and smoke in the areas of planned firing operations.

### **Air Operations**

GIS (Geographic Information System) mapping operations are being conducted throughout Mendocino County. Residents may see low flying rotary aircraft for the purposes of mapping fire perimeters.

Numerous fixed wing and rotary aircraft continue to operate on the fires.

### **Evacuations**

Evacuation "Warnings" remain in effect for:

- Mountain View Road from Mile Post 15 to Mile Post 20
- Community of Rockport
- De Haven Creek and Howard Creek drainage, North of Westport
