



## FIRE FACT SHEET LIGHTNING SERIES

### CAL FIRE TEHAMA GLENN UNIT WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25, 2008

Approximately 36 lightning caused fires began on Saturday, June 21, 2008 within Tehama County.

#### Locations of the largest fires:

##### EAST SIDE (Paynes Creek Area)

Antelope Creek Fire	4,200 acres	20% containment
Mill Creek Fire	7,000 acres	No containment

##### WEST SIDE – 36W

Salt Creek Fire	40 acres	Contained
Vestal Fire	181 acres	95% contained

Total acreage of ALL fires – 11,881 Acres      Total containment – 15%

Committed Resources: 5 hand crews, 1 helicopter, 16 engines, 8 dozers, 9 water tenders, 23 fire support staff – total personnel committed – 221

Structures Threatened – None      Structures Damaged – None  
No structures destroyed –      No evacuations  
Highway 36W closed between Baker Station and Wildwood

Growth Potential – High      Difficulty of Terrain – High  
Moderate rate of spread with significant runs.

**Fire Behavior:** Moderate fire spread with flare ups. Mill fire, access difficult and very slow travel for ground resources. On Antelope fire attempting to hold fire within the 5,000 acre control lines. If fire exceeds control lines, it has potential to grow to 20,000 acres. Priority is to control fires currently holding with existing lines. Continue to find new fires with access problems.

On the Noble fire we are assisting Shasta National Forest to keep fire from entering the Tehama Glenn State Protected Land.

Cooperating Agencies: Tehama County Fire, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, National Park Service, Glenn County Fire and Colusa County Fire.
