**CAL FIRE TEHAMA GLENN UNIT
THURSDAY, JUNE 26, 2008
7:00 A.M. UPDATE**

Approximately 41 lightning caused fires began on Saturday, June 21, 2008 within Tehama County.

Locations of the largest fires:

EAST SIDE (Paynes Creek Area)

Antelope Creek Fire	3,000 acres	35% containment
Mill Creek Fire	11,360 acres	30% containment

WEST SIDE – 36W

Vestal Fire	181 acres	100% contained
Noble Fire	3,200 acres	

(TGU Cal Fire assisting Shasta Unit and Shasta Trinity National Forest with fire Protection and line construction on east flank of Beegum Gorge. Evacuation Notices were issued at midnight to residents in R-Ranch and Ball Road.)

Noble fire is burning on both sides of Highway 36W in Tehama County on State Protected Land.

Total acreage of ALL fires – 14,541 Acres Total containment – 30%

Committed Resources: 5 hand crews, 2 helicopter, 16 engines, 8 dozers, 9 water tenders, 23 fire support staff – total personnel committed – 230

Structures Threatened – 60 plus Structures damaged or destroyed - None

Highway 36W closed – 31 miles west of Red Bluff

**Growth Potential – High Difficulty of Terrain – High
Moderate rate of spread with significant runs.**

Fire Behavior: Moderate fire spread with flare ups. Mill fire, access difficult and very long slow travel for ground resources. Antelope fire, attempting to hold fire within the 5,000 acre control lines. If fire exceeds control lines, it has potential to grow to 20,000 acres. Priority is to control fires currently holding with existing lines. Continue to find new fires with access problems.

Cooperating Agencies: Tehama County Fire, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, National Park Service, Glenn County Fire, Colusa County Fire, Lassen National Forest and Shasta Trinity National Forest.
