**CAL FIRE TEHAMA GLENN UNIT
MONDAY, JUNE 30, 2008
7:00 A.M. UPDATE**

Approximately 41 lightning caused fires began on Saturday, June 21, 2008 within Tehama County.

TGU Cal Fire assisting Shasta Unit and Shasta Trinity National Forest with Fire protection on State DPA. Complete perimeter line around fire. Fire has limited movement. Noble fire is our number one priority.
Structures are threatened in R-Ranch, Ball Road and ranches on 36W.

Total acreage of ALL fires – 22,907 acres Total containment – 60%
Injuries – 5

**Committed Resources: 6 hand crews, 2 helicopter, 12 engines, 10 dozers,
7 water tenders, 45 fire support staff – total personnel committed - 274**

Structures Threatened – Approximately 175 2 structures destroyed (Ball Road)

Growth Potential – Low Difficulty of Terrain – High

Fire Behavior: Moderate fire spread with flare ups. Mill fire, access difficult and very long slow travel for ground resources. SRA portion has line around and holding within control line. Antelope Fire is holding within control line. Mop up and patrol action. Expected total containment on Antelope & Mill 6/30/08 at 1800 hrs. Noble Assist Fire highest priority with structures threatened. Redirect resources to Noble. Continue dozer line around perimeter. Closely watching fire in Yolla Bolly that could cross into Tehama County State Protected Land.

Cooperating Agencies: Tehama County Fire, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, National Park Service, Glenn County Fire, Colusa County Fire, Lassen National Forest and Shasta Trinity National Forest, Tehama County Sheriff, Tehama County Animal Control, CHP, Cal Trans
