



**FIRE FACT SHEET

**CAL FIRE TEHAMA GLENN UNIT
TUESDAY, JULY 1, 2008
7:00 A.M. UPDATE**

Approximately 41 lightning caused fires began on Saturday, June 21, 2008 within Tehama County.

Locations of the largest fires:

EAST SIDE (Paynes Creek Area)

Antelope Creek Fire	3,410 acres	100% contained -100% controlled
Mill Creek Fire	13,580 acres	100% contained -100% controlled

WEST SIDE – 36W

Noble Assist (Tehama County) 5,118 acres 65% Contained
TGU Cal Fire assisting Shasta Unit and Shasta Trinity National Forest with fire protection on State DPA. Fire is around Beegum Peak, steep rocky terrain. Line construction from Hwy 36W to Beegum Peak to Tedoc Road. Structures are threatened in R-Ranch, Ball Road and ranches on 36W.

Total acreage of ALL fires – 22,907 acres Total containment – 65%
Injuries – 5

Committed Resources: 6 hand crews, 2 helicopter, 11 engines, 6 dozers, 6 water tenders, 40 fire support staff – total personnel committed - 234

Structures Threatened – Approximately 175 2 structures destroyed (Ball Road)

Growth Potential – Low Difficulty of Terrain – High

Fire Behavior: Noble Assist Fire has growth potential of 1000 acres. Fire around Beegum Peak in steep rocky terrain transitioning into heavier fuels. Down canyon winds have potential to push fire to the south towards Pattymocus Lookout, Butte and Long Gulch. Continue line construction from Hwy 36W to Beegum Peak to Tedoc Road. Mop up and patrol. Closely watching fire in Yolla Bolly that could cross into Tehama County State Protected Land.

Cooperating Agencies: Tehama County Fire, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, National Park Service, Glenn County Fire, Colusa County Fire, Lassen National Forest and Shasta Trinity National Forest, Tehama County Sheriff, Tehama County Animal Control, CHP, Cal Trans
