



Walker Fire

Acreage: 14,500 acres

Containment: 70%

Location: Western Lake County / East Colusa County in the Indian Valley Reservoir/Walker Ridge/Bear Valley areas.

Weather: Weather conditions for today call for moderate winds out of the northeast at 10-15 mph. The high temperature is predicted to be 99 degrees. The relative humidity is predicted to be 18 percent.

Evacuations Lifted: All voluntary evacuations for the Double Eagle Ranch (25 Structures), Bear Valley Ranch (1 structure) and Wilbur Hot Springs (10 structures) have been lifted.

Resources: Engines: 51 Crews: 15 Helicopters: 7 Airtankers: 0
Dozers: 24 Water Tenders: 16 Total personnel: 689

- The fire started on Sunday, June 22 at 4:41 p.m near the southern end of Indian Valley Reservoir.
- Resources from the Wild Fire in Solano County have been reassigned to this incident.
- Fire activity is minimal, with aggressive mop up in progress.
- 6 Firefighter injuries – all minor.
- Excess resources are now being reassigned to other fires throughout Northern California.
- Fire was caused by a vehicle being driven in the area whose metal undercarriage struck a rock.
