Comments:

This combination barracks is one of seven USFS-CCC "D-10" types in the CDF building collection that date from the CCC era. The building design was a common choice for both CDF and Forest Service fire suppression stations. The building plan was also used after the CCC era as evidenced by the 1946 combination barracks at the Coulterville Forest Fire Station. The Campo building was remodeled in the early 1970s with new siding, window replacement, and other alterations. An external HVAC system with ducting enclosure is located on the west gable end. The building has retained its original footprint and roof line. An added feature is the enclosed outside entry which leads to the basement. Only this "D-10" building and the one at the Valley Center Forest Fire Station have this setup.

Comments:

There are two CCC era combination barracks and garage stations in the CDF building collection that are made of rock construction. Both of them have different floor plans and stylistic treatments. The subject building consists of a 22' x 50' wing composed of rock walls and a 23' x 25' wing composed of a combination of rock and wood frame (with cedar slab siding over the wood frame section). This wing has a 14' x 23' addition that appears to have been added after the original construction but before 1953. The building, overall, has a high degree of historic architectural integrity. The station is located in the Cuyamaca State Park which explains its rusticated architecture. Not recorded for this project is an associated ranger's residence of rock composition which is located on an adjoining parcel. The house belongs to the State Park.

This is one of the very few pre-1946 buildings in the CDF collection that was originally constructed by and for another entity. The Dulzura Forest Fire Station was originally a State Highway Maintenance Station. The property was transferred to CDF circa 1974 and the existing buildings remodeled. The subject house is probably based on a standardized plan used by the State Division of Highways in the 1940s. Although remodeled, it appears to still reflect much of its historic integrity. Caltrans is in the process of conducting a historic building inventory. Information from that study will assist in completing the evaluation of this building.

Comments:

The tower was originally erected by the CCC on Estelle Peak. In 1967 the old lookout was moved to the Ryan Airport and a new cab installed. California Department of Corrections inmates were used in the relocation project. Comments:

The property record for this site identifies this as an old tool shed. CDF and USFS air operations commenced at the Ryan Airport in 1957. The two agencies began sharing facilities in the early 1960s. The Ryan Airport was established before the air operations started thus explaining the older date for the subject building. The tool shed was remodeled and converted to a gas and oil house in the late 1960s. These changes and the fact that it is an ancillary building are why it is not given a rarity score. Also located at this base is a large wood frame storage building which may predate 1946. Next to this is a steel quonset hut warehouse which appears to be a military surplus building from the 1950s.

Comments:

There are seven buildings in the CDF collection that appear to be based on a standardized 25' x 40' floor plan. These buildings were probably based on a variation of the USFS-CCC "D" design series. They've all undergone varying degrees of remodeling. The Lyons Valley building has experienced a few minor changes and the front entry porch screens have been replaced with glass windows. But the building is the best example left in the CDF collection of this particular design variation. The building and site are considered significant historic resources.

Comments:

The building has a slightly larger foot print than other two vehicle stall garages and features a "saltbox" roof design. The front slope of the roof has been cut and elevated over the vehicle bay entrance. This modification has significantly affected the historic character of the building. Several other garages have been revised in the same manner in order to accommodate the larger fire engines in today's fleet. The building is considered a contributor to the associated combination barracks historic setting.

Comments:

The S-5 Form reports that this was a 26' x 34' building. This represents the width of the front wing and the length of the rear wing. No reference is made to a second story. Occasionally the S-5 Forms only give an approximation and this may explain the discrepancy. However, the house has a stucco veneer (CCC era wood frame houses were either covered with "v" rustic or anzac siding) which suggests that the building may have been remodeled and possibly enlarged after original construction. These alterations took place by 1950, as shown by photographic evidence. The main unit of the house features an arched entry porch recessed under the principal roof. The porch arcades were framed-in prior to 1951. The walls were covered with "v" rustic siding and featured screened fenestration. The screens were later removed and the openings boarded up. Since the first field visit the porch has been restored to its original appearance. Unfortunately, metal security bars have been installed over the ground floor windows and doors which adversely affect the building's historic character. Overall, though, this is considered an important historic resource.

Comments:

This is the original residence garage for the associated ranger's residence. A one car garage was erected closer to the house circa 1950 but that building was removed this summer (1994). The subject building is the only residence garage in the CDF building collection composed of rock. The garage doors have been removed and the space framed-in with temporary walls of poor quality. Apart from these minor changes the building looks virtually the same today as when it was first built. Both the house and garage are situated on a hill overlooking the main compound. Landscaping around the two buildings helps to screen this area from the rest of the station compound.

Comments:

The S-5 Form reports the building as being constructed by San Bernardino County for CDF. It's probable, though, that WPA labor was used. The original 67' x 34' floor plan consisted of an east unit serving as the fire crew's quarters, a central unit housing the fire trucks, and a west unit used as a ranger's residence, an unusual design to say the least. Another unique feature was a hose drying tower which consisted of an observation platform located on the roof over the truck bay. This is the only reinforced concrete fire station building in the CDF building collection that dates from the CCC era. The building is wedged between two county roads with virtually no more clearance than the width of a sidewalk on either side. The site also features river rock retaining walls. Comments:

There are two CCC era combination barracks and garage stations in the CDF building collection that are composed of rock. Both of them have different floor plans and stylistic treatments. The West Riverside building was originally divided into a two stall garage on the west end, fire crew quarters in the central section, and ranger's residence on the east end. A new apparatus building was constructed nearby and the east bay in the old garage subsequently converted to a station office. The garage door was removed and the space framed-in. Internally, a hole was cut between the crew quarters and residence portions of the building and the entire area now serves as a combination barracks. Screened openings for the front porch have been glazed with divided light windows. Despite these changes, and some other cosmetic alterations, the building still retains most of its historic architectural character. It is considered a significant historic resource.
